Youth Empowerment for Sustainable Development of Society and Economy



Summit Overview

The 4th International Youth to Youth Summit took place on 31st of May - 04th of June 2018 in Malmo, Sweden, and focused on the topic Youth Empowerment for Sustainable Development of Society and Economy. The event was co-organised by Youth to Youth Initiative, a Lithuanian based NGO and a local partner STPLN from Malmo, Sweden. The 2018 edition gathered altogether 100 delegates from 50 countries, including Sweden with the aim of sharing views, practices and coming up with the solutions to one of the most pressing challenges of today's world- sustainable future.

The Summits, planned on an annual basis, encourage youth to come up with the solutions for the most pressing issues the world is facing via cross-disciplinary dialogue. International Youth to Youth Summit aims to provide a platform for youth as future leaders of the world that allows engaging in the discussion regarding the most pressing challenges that the world is facing.

The mission of the Summit is to bring together the brightest students, youth activists, leaders in the society, entrepreneurs, professors and businessman to start a dialogue on global challenges of today and tomorrow and to work together after the summit on actions which would create a more just, tolerant and sustainable society. The Summit aimed at increasing understanding of the facets youth bring social innovations in our daily life. Summit's activities have been designed to create a multinational functional dialogue and to inspire the development of new tools and creative means to create a sustainable future. Besides, the event aimed at providing a number of networking sub-events including cultural activities and enhancement of the Y2Y Alumni Network, which serves as a space for strengthening unity between youth from different continents of the world, as well as bridging the gap among the countries.

Each year the organizing team strives to select participants with varied professional and academic backgrounds. The participants are selected from a competitive pool based on their expertise with consideration of geographical and gender balance. The target group on the summit was between 18 and 35 years old, and mainly included students and young professionals from international relations, sustainable development, politics, economics and business backgrounds, leaders of the communities, change makers, passionate to create positive social change.

To provide participants of the Summit with a unique set of skills, necessary for their development as leaders and professionals for the creation of a pool of competitive activists with a great potential for fostering change and co-creating sustainable communities.

Summit's activities

The program of the 4th International Youth to Youth Summit has been diversified and has made use of a number of methods such as panel sessions, workshops, discussions and informal sessions.

Apart from dividing the topic into 6 panels described below, the Summit through workshops has also aimed to provide participants with unique skills which would help them to become stronger and more knowledgeable leaders. The event has also featured cultural activities such as opening informal event, lunch at the town hall of Malmo City, meditation and mindfulness workshop, movie night.

Problem Statement

The Global Youth Population Report 2016 estimates that in 2017, World Youth Population will reach 1.8 billion youth between the age 15-29, almost 90 % living in less developed countries, while according to the International organization for labour (IOL) trends, youth unemployment is on the rise. The youth unemployment rate in the world is predicted to rise to 13.1 % in 2017, which corresponds to 71 million unemployed youth. Taking into consideration UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which UN General Assembly adopted in 2015, addressing the young person needs, rights, capabilities, commitment and active involvement in the implementation of the SDGs is vital. However, the voices and potential of young people are very often not taken into consideration or even neglected. More than that, young people continue facing various challenges, such as lack of access to quality education, unemployment, lack of decent work opportunities, political participation, – just to mention a few.

Very often youth faces inequalities and discrimination based on their gender, sexual orientation, disability, ethnicity, race. According to OECD Report 2016, in 2015, only a little bit over one-third out of 183 countries have achieved gender equality in the enrollment in the secondary education level. And yet with the rise of the usage of social media and digital technologies, young people today are more active and engaged in community development, social entrepreneurship than ever before. Young people have started to express their voices, opinions, demand for their rights, challenge the status quo of the old structures. The world youth community is connecting with each other, getting organised and co-creating campaigns, projects, startups for sustainable social and environmental development of our cities and communities. It is hard to neglect the fact that the youth today are the leaders of today and tomorrow. We have seen that since 2009, the youth were able to mobilize and start movements, challenge the old political structures and lead social, economic and political transformations worldwide. Today, we can see the rise of the number of young community leaders, change agents, activists, social entrepreneurs who have the same goal, – to bring a positive change in local, national and international levels. From improving the education, building dialogue between nations, combating discrimination, hate speech online to solving youth unemployment by creating social enterprises by themselves. Governments, business and civil society organisations today have the chance to build sustainable communities together with young people and embrace the innovative and creative mindset of the younger generations.

Sustainability

The founders of the Y2Y Initiative realize that in order to create change, the process needs to be sustainable and a strong commitment and investment from young leaders and youth organizations themselves is needed. Therefore, a simple sustainability model in which the roles of each of the aspects of the Y2Y Initiative take up in the entire process has been built. Developing, mentoring and implementing youth initiatives takes time and longer-term commitment that facilitate more strategic, sustainable programming as opposed to short-term, one-time events.

While the annual thematic International Summits create a starting point, provide food for thought and overall create an environment that encourages creativity and dialogue that allow to plant seeds for partnerships and produce joint projects, the Summer School on Social Entrepreneurship & Sustainable Project Management provides the tools and resources for project implementation, capacity building and further grow about the positive impact of youth-led initiatives. Furthermore, other training courses which Y2Y organize throughout the year, equip youth with relevant skills to become change makers in their local communities.

Unicity of the concept allows "Youth to Youth Initiative" to work on three different levels: with youth, during the annual thematic International Summit, designed as a platform for dialogue and networking; with projects under "Youth to Youth Action Hub", a highly responsive, community-driven online incubator for socially beneficial ideas, projects, initiatives, non-for-profit organizations and businesses created by youth and for youth; and with young leaders from all around the world through "Youth to Youth's Young Leaders Network" aiming to maximize the impact of youth-led initiatives on international level, promote the vision and the mission of "Youth to Youth Initiative" and help to raise awareness about challenges concerning youth.

Results of the Summit

The 4th International Youth to Youth Summit gathered together 100 participants from 50 countries over 4 days (31st of May - 04th of June 2018) in Malmo, Sweden. The event featured 20 prominent speakers and workshop facilitators from 15 different countries.

The location of the 5th International Youth to Youth Summit have been decided. The Summit in 2019 will take place in Hong Kong. The topic of the 5th Summit was selected the topic under the broad name «Future of the world» where we will explore the future of innovation, space, future economy and ecology.

- The Board of International Youth to Youth Initiative announced the 2nd Summer School on „Social Entrepreneurship and Sustainable Project Management” which was a follow-up activity of the Summit and it took place from 01st to 06th of July 2018 in Daugirdiskes, Lithuania;

- A training course “Human Rights through Human Wisdom”, which will take place at the end of February 2019 in Vietnam was developed during the Summit with Deepak Ramola, the Founder of Project FUEL, India.

The Summit plays a critical role as a starting point for a yearlong online and offline discussions, it builds trust and creates a barrier-free environment for further international cooperation.

SUMMER SCHOOL OVERVIEW

The 2nd edition of Y2Y Summer School took place Daugirdiskes, Lithuania from the 1st to the 6th of July. The whole course was focused on the practical aspects around implementing projects and building business in a sustainable way. The event was organised by Youth to Youth Initiative, a Lithuanian based NGO with international status. The training brought together 15 youth workers, young professionals, entrepreneurs and researchers from 6 countries, including developing countries such as Belarus, Azerbaijan, Lithuania and Ukraine and developed countries such as Luxembourg and Denmark with the aim of learning ways of leading projects sustainably and develop as well as sustain social enterprises and be engaged in social entrepreneurship.

In 2017 Youth to Youth Initiative has launched the Summer School for early social entrepreneurs. The first edition of the Summer School took place in Sweden and was devoted to the project management and building successful social enterprises. The event was decided to conduct on an annual basis.

The purpose of the Summer School is to provide participants with the inspiration, connections, and tools needed to initiate and implement socially conscious projects and teach basics necessary for launching their own social enterprises. The program of the Summer School is designed to be partly a school, partly a retreat, meaning that participants will not only come away with functional tools for project design and implementation, but will gain support or/and inspiration for the journey of creating and implementing socially conscious projects in the non-for-profit/ social entrepreneurship world.

Participants are selected from the pool of social change makers, leaders interested in sustainable and conscious project management and development and those who plan to enter start-up world or start their own social enterprise. The target group of the Summer School is between 18 and 35 years old, and mainly included students, community leaders, young professionals, youth workers and early stage entrepreneurs of a various backgrounds.

SUSTAINABILITY & RESULTS

The Summer School is a great opportunity to explore how social entrepreneurship and corporate social responsibility contribute to business model innovation, what are the ways to build a social enterprise in a sustainable way and how to use social innovations both in project development and business. By integrating social innovation and social value creation within the framework of business models, the Summer School allows to focus on new approaches to innovation that lead to improved business and civic sectors both in terms of economic and social value.

Participants are invited to test all models, try their ideas on canvas and prototype solutions during the period of the Summer School, after the training is over, selected participants who decide to create their own social enterprises, are guided through the implementation and set-up period for at least half a year.

The second edition of the Summer School resulted in the building of a social enterprise in Ukraine in the rural area conducted by two participants from the corresponding country. The further results will be gathered throughout a half a year and reported separately if necessary.

Moreover, over the course of the Summer School participants had the opportunity to explore their own leadership skills, look at how they want to develop them and how they want to make a difference in the world. They have also worked collaboratively with others to design and rehearse new and innovative approaches to managing projects in a sustainable way and adopted them to their own realities back in the home countries. The overall grade of the Summer School's quality was indicated by participants as 9,5 points out of 10 possible points.

By the end of the Summer School participants learned how to:

- explore innovative approaches to leadership for a better world;
- reflect and improve their own leadership skills and attributes;
- use different types of social business forms;
- apply aspects of sustainability to business and non-commercial fields;
- successfully measure the impact;
- use participatory decision-making process;
- work collaboratively with others – and reflect on their own team-working skills;
- design and deliver their collaborative follow-up projects;
- successfully pitch their ideas and become a prominent speaker;
- look at what they can do in their own community to introduce more innovative approach towards business and sustainability.
